(Dis)enrollment Policy

The Hermon School Committee recognizes the importance of regular student attendance and academic rigor as it relates to being successful in the course work offered to students at Hermon High School. Consequently, students who are not upholding their responsibility in regard to regular attendance as well as the completion of class work and homework shall be (dis)enrolled from a particular course for the remainder of the semester. (The guidelines for regular attendance and academic success are contained within school policy and the student handbook.)

Students (dis)enrolled from a course in the first semester may reapply for admission in the second semester and receive one half credit for their work in that discipline. Students (dis)enrolled in the second semester will have the opportunity to retake the course if course is offered. If the student had acceptable attendance and had successfully completed the first semester's work prior to (dis)enrollment, he/she will be given credit for the first semester's work.

The building principal will have the authority to (dis)enroll students. Guidance, teachers, parents and the student involved will be informed of actions being taken or contemplated during the process.

Principals and faculty will develop a list of interventions and modifications to help the students succeed.
